Important information regarding Short Format Events

Marathon attire (no shorts) is acceptable in both dressage and cones.

Helmets must be worn during marathon and cones, and it is strongly suggested to wear helmets in the warm up arenas.

Back Protectors must be worn on marathon.

Veterinarians are on call, not on site.

Pneumatic Tires are permitted in ALL DIVISIONS.

In the Beginner and Training divisions at Short Format Driving Events, verbal outside assistance is allowed in any competition phase, including Dressage. The groom or an outside assistant standing by the arena may call out the dressage test for Beginner and Training level classes without any penalty. Electronic communication equipment may also be used as long as only one earphone is used at a time while on the carriage.

At Short Format Driving Events with a Modified Marathon, the whole course must be open for inspection by athletes at 12:00 pm (noon) the day before the scheduled start.

At Short Format Driving Events, in the Modified Marathon, an athlete who fails to pass through a CTF in the published sequence and direction will incur 5 penalties per error (and no elimination).

The pace in Section B is free, except for Beginner and Training who may only WALK OR TROT in Section B, including the obstacles.

Drivers and/or navigators may go round the marathon course a maximum of 2 times, if schedule allows. This also applies to sharing of carriage or harness. Competitors wishing to share navigators, drivers acting as navigators, carriages

or harness must complete the Special Request for Sharing Form. Failure to complete the form will result in the request not being honored. This form must be turned in to the Scorer when competitor numbers are picked up at the show office.

Additional Information

Veterinary and Health Requirements: Flu and Rhino within 6 months of show date and Coggins within 1 year of show date.

Awards, Championships and Prize Money (if applicable): Six Ribbons for each class.

Food available on grounds: No, bring your own lunch.

Dog Policy: All dogs must be on a leash and under control at all times. Please do not take your dogs to the dressage ring or the cones ring during competition, or take your dog into the obstacles. Loose dogs, or dogs dragging a leash, will incur a fine of \$25 for the first offense, \$50 for the second, and so on and will increase by \$25 each time. You will need to come to the show office to collect your dog.

Sharps Container: Competition Management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USEF thanks you for participating in this competition and your support of USEF's continuous efforts to provide the safest environment possible for our athletes and other participants. This includes the SafeSport Training requirement for adult members and participants who have regular contact with or authority over minor athletes. Additionally, please be reminded about reporting obligations. Any concerns that are non-sexual in nature, please use the USEF Safe Sport Incident Reporting Form available on the USEF website. Concerns or suspicions regarding sexual misconduct must be reported to https://safesport.i-sight.com/portal and the authorities if a minor is involved. Thank you for your support and for helping us bring the joy of horse sports to as many people as possible!

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes
